TODAY'S SPEAKER

Christine Kaczmarek, Community Engagement Coordinator Margarita Springer, Development Director Community Caregivers

After Christine Kaczmarek retired from Skidmore College as Senior Director of Business Services, she looked for volunteer opportunities. She began volunteering at Community Caregivers and after 18 months was asked to take a part time paid position. She said it's been an extraordinary experience.

Community Caregivers was begun in 1994 by a vet, and RN and a pharmacist in Altamont to serve people with needs in the community.

Some of the needs are very basic, such as having someone climb a ladder and change a light bulb so that a resident is not afraid to go into her bathroom in the dark.

Now, 20 years later the organization has ten part time employees and one full time employee that are paid with grant money. There are around 100 active volunteers. They serve the Albany area excluding Colonie, which already has significant services for seniors, and Rensselaer County.

Services are provided that will enable people to stay in their homes and include medical transportation, grocery shopping, reassurance calls, wellness check-ins and also help with banking, picking up medications and personal appointments.

There are currently about 200 clients being served.

Community Caregivers is always looking for additional volunteers.

The not-for-profit organization is funded by grants and donations. Fundraisers include the Fall Gala, held at the Albany Country Club and a summer golf tournament.

A new event is a Trivia night being held Aug. 22 at Indian Ladder Farms from 6 to 8 pm.

People who need services can call Community Caregivers. They will be visited by two RNs and a social worker who will introduce the client to Community Caregivers and validate whether it is a good match for the services they offer.

If it is a good match, requests for services will go out to volunteers.

Volunteers must complete an application and are subject to a background check.

There is no charge to the client for any services, and no income requirement. Community Caregivers tries to ascertain that the client does not have other resources available to them so that they're not duplicating services. They will make referrals to other agencies if needed.

Any help you can give this organization is appreciated, even volunteering one hour a month or whatever you are able to offer.
